

Connect: With God ~ With People ~ On Purpose

I. Sing We Noel

1: In the stillness of a humble Judean night, the world waited – longing for hope, longing for peace. And out in the fields, shepherds kept watch over their flock, unaware that heaven was about to break into their ordinary world.

Narrators: Alison Streiff & Bob Lee

- 2: 'And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified." (Luke 2:8-9)
- 1: Fear trembled in their hearts ... until heaven spoke.
- 2: But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people." (Luke 2:10)
- 1: Good news... for all people. News of a Savior promised from long ago.
- 2: For an angel had already whispered hope to Joseph, saying, "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sin." (Matthew 1:21.)
- 1: In a world longing for hope, God gave His Son. In a night filled with silence, God spoke peace. In the hearts of the shepherds and kings, God lit a flame of joy that still burns today.
- 2: This is the story of Noel The story of Jesus The story of God's love shining into the darkness, inviting all people to come, behold, and believe.

II. It Came Upon the Midnight Clear

1: It came upon a midnight clear – A night when the world lay hushed under heaven's gaze. The weary earth, burdened with longing, waited for a promise.

And then, through the stillness, the prophets' words echoed once more...

- 2: "For to us a Child is born, to us a Son is given; and the government will be on His shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
- 1: Generations heard those words and held them close, Yet the night remained silent Until that midnight when heaven finally broke open. Not with thunder ... but with a child's cry.
- 2: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you who is Christ the Lord. This shall be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths, lying in a manger."

III. A Child Is Born

- 1: "Mary had a baby ... My Lord." These words echo across generations, reminding us of a night when heaven touched earth. A child -fragile and humble, was laid in a manger. But this was no ordinary child.
- 2: Mary had a baby, yes ... but this baby is the Savior. The one whose words astonish. The one who welcomes worship from the wise. The one who brings light into our darkness.

IV. Sing Gloria

- 1: In the stillness of that holy night, heaven could no longer remain silent. As shepherds watched over their flocks, the sky burst open with glory. "Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared, praising God and saying ..."
- 2: "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests." The angels announced a peace the world had never known peace wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.
- 1: But the Child who arrived in humility would not remain hidden. The One born in a stable would one day be lifted high above every throne and every name.
- 2: For Scripture declares, "God exalted Him and gave Him the name above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow -in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

V. The Shepherd's Visit

- 1: When the angels returned to heaven, the night grew still again over the hills of Bethlehem. The shepherds looked at one another, their hearts still echoing the glory they had witnessed.
- 2: With urgency and awe they said, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing which has come to pass, that the Lord has made known to us." And together they hurried toward the town, the starlight guiding their steps.
- 1: After seeing Him, they could not keep silent. They went out into the night, proclaiming to all they met what had been told to them about this Child good new of great joy.
- 2: The shepherds returned to their field changed glorifying and praising God for everything they had heard and seen.
